- Further involvement and engagement during break times throughout the school. Coaches delivering new games and sports for <u>all</u> children to participate in.
- Sports challenge continued to support and train staff through 'shared teaching' approach, including monitoring and assessment of pupils. Teachers becoming more confident in their ability to deliver high quality PE lessons.

- The skipping workshop allowed opportunities for children to try new sports. Since the
 event, children regularly skip at break times and lunch times to achieve '100 skips a
 day.'

Impact:

- New and exciting lunchtime games and sports for <u>all</u> children to participate in through a new provider.
- Direct Sports Provision support and train staff through shared planning, teaching and assessment. This has improved the quality of PE lessons.
- The dance workshop showed children different cultures such as South Africa and India. The children participated in an hour's worth of dance and learned challenging routines to remember and then perform.
- The new equipment for the PE shed was used to improve the quality of PE lessons and lunchtime and after school clubs.
- The swimming gala, bell boating and main games gave children the opportunity to compete in sports that they have practiced against other schools. The schools that took part were all schools that are in the cluster. This means that the children could make new friends prior to starting Bredon Middle.

- The country dancing event for Key Stage One gave the children an opportunity to learn and perform a dance in front of a large audience.
- The Helm Training resulted in another Key Stage Two teacher qualified officially to lead a group of children on a bell boat prior to the bell boating event.

- Provide children with enrichment days that give them access to new sports.

- Use external gymnastics teachers to improve the confidence of teacher's gymnastics lessons.
- For all staff's confidence to improve teaching <u>safe</u> and <u>high quality</u> PE lessons.
- For the school to run a wider range of 'intra-sport' (within the school) tournaments to provide children with an opportunity to competitively participate in sports with each other.
- For all Year 5 children to participate in the 'Play Leaders' scheme.

<u>Impact</u>
