 - The **Arctic Ocean** to the north

- Some well-known European countries include:
 - **United Kingdom** – London
 - **France** – Paris
 - **Spain** – Madrid
 - **Italy** – Rome
 - **Germany** – Berlin

William Morris (1834–1896)

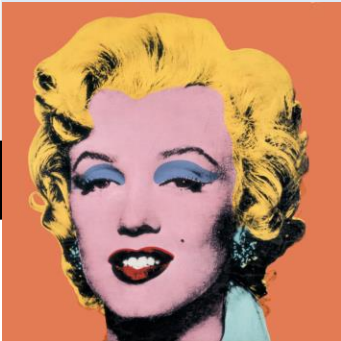
- A designer and artist from the Arts and Crafts Movement.
