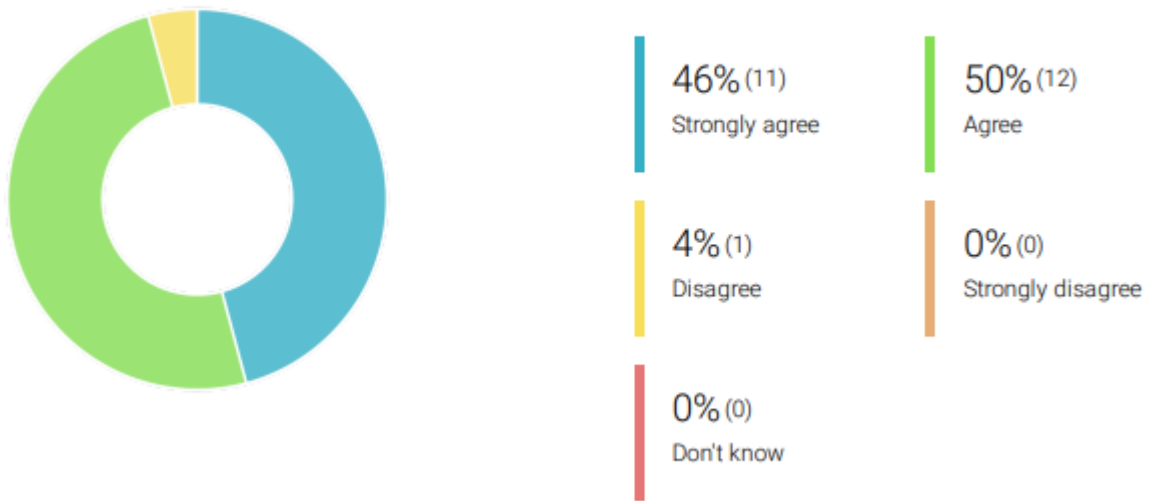




## Broadway First School – Parent Questionnaire Results

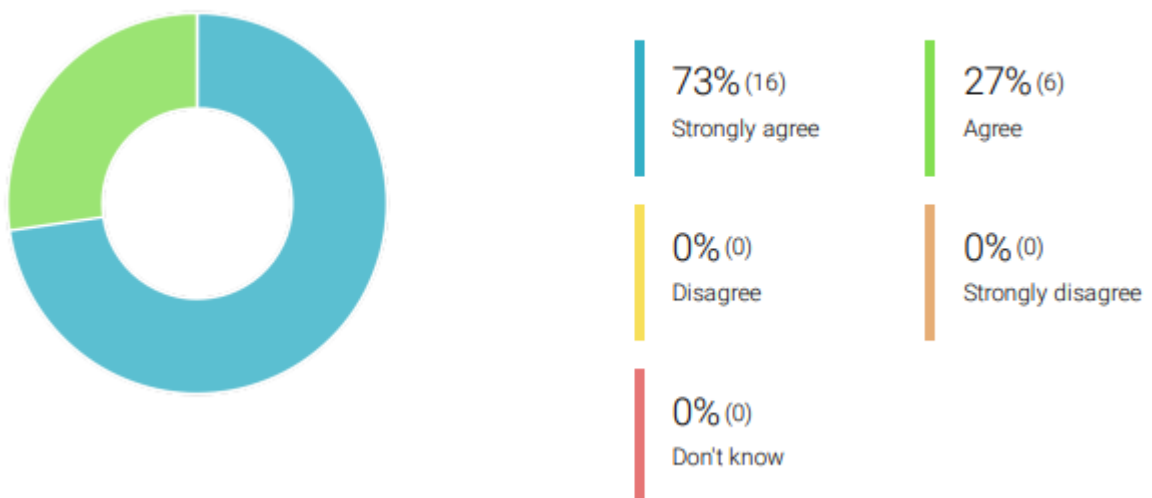
The parent questionnaire was sent out to parents on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2022, with questions based on Ofsted's Parentview template. The school received 24 responses from a possible 68 families (73 inc pre-school). We appreciate feedback at any time so please do not hesitate in speaking to us if you have any questions or concerns. Results are displayed below.

### My child is happy at this school.



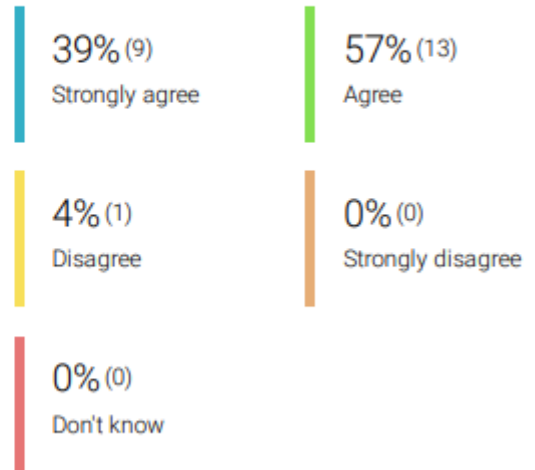
A majority of 96% believe their children to be happy at the school.

### My child feels safe at this school.



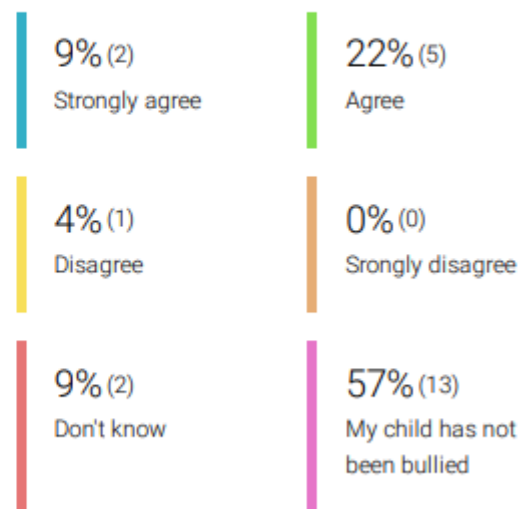
All respondents believe their children feel safe at school.

The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.



96% of respondents agree that school makes sure pupils are well behaved. We receive many positive comments about the conduct of our pupils from visitors and when out on trips.

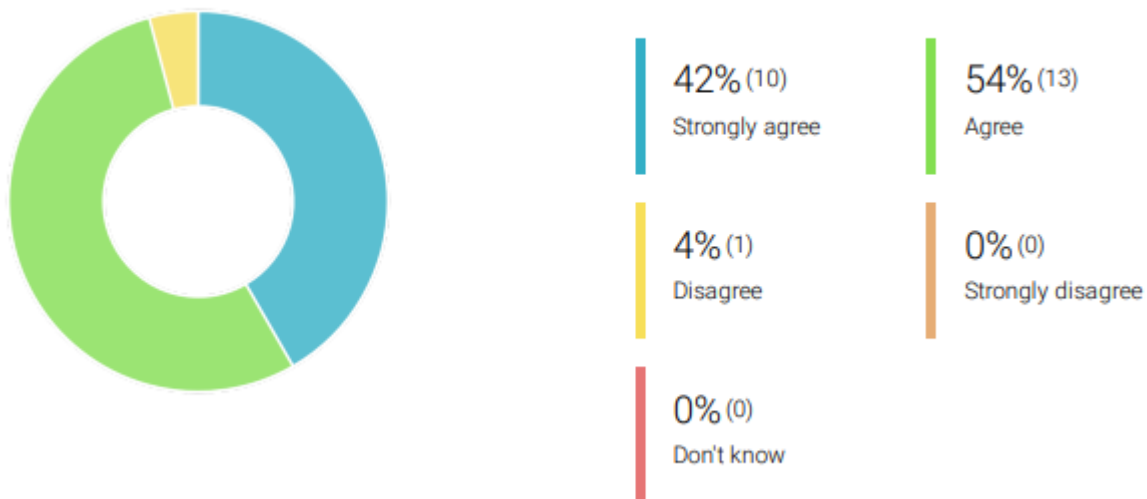
My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.



88% of respondents either have children that have not been bullied, strongly agreed or agreed that school dealt with any issues swiftly. A further 9% did not know, which most likely means they did not experiencing bullying.

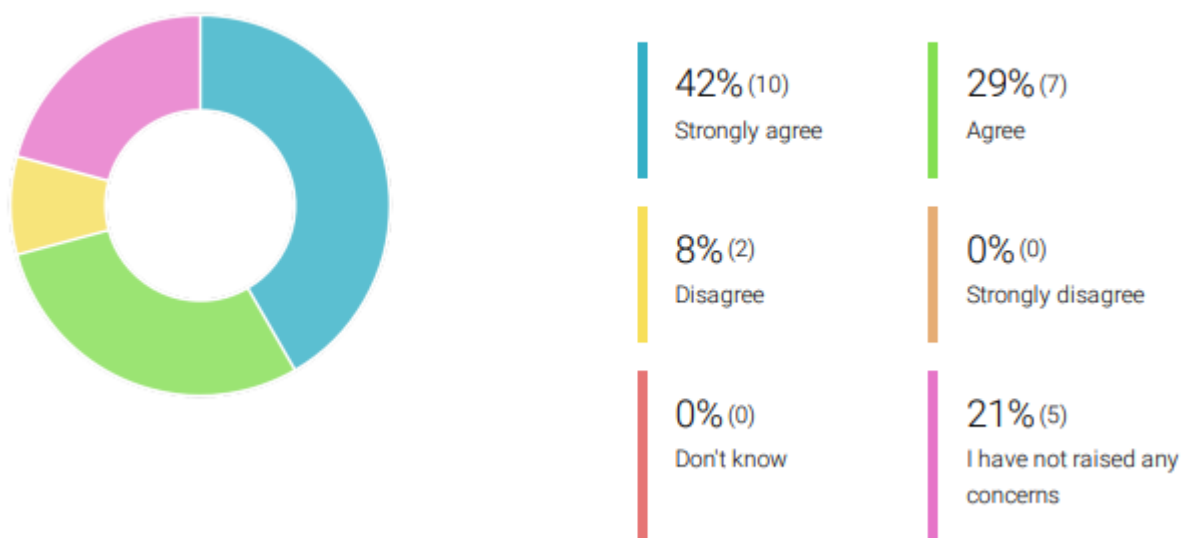
One respondent replied with disagree. The school take all incidents of bullying seriously and urge parents to communicate openly if they have any concerns.

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.



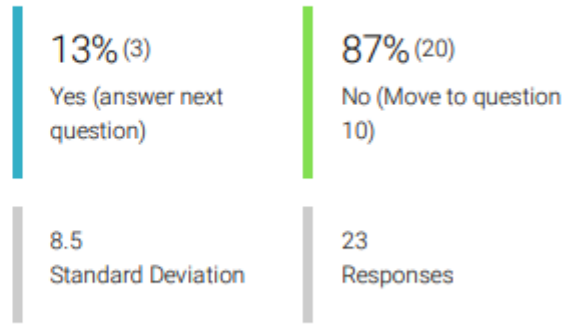
96% strongly agreed or agreed that the school do make parents aware of what the children will learn. The curriculum is available on the school’s website detailing a long-term overview of learning for each class and progression maps that show how children progress year on year in each subject. Each new topic is accompanied with a topic fact sheet that is sent home and made available on the website. In addition, our weekly newsletter shares learning for each class, summarising the learning that week along with accompanying photos. This is also shared on our Facebook page. The school maintains its duty of providing two parents’ evenings in the autumn and spring terms and a fully compliant end of year report to parents.

When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly.



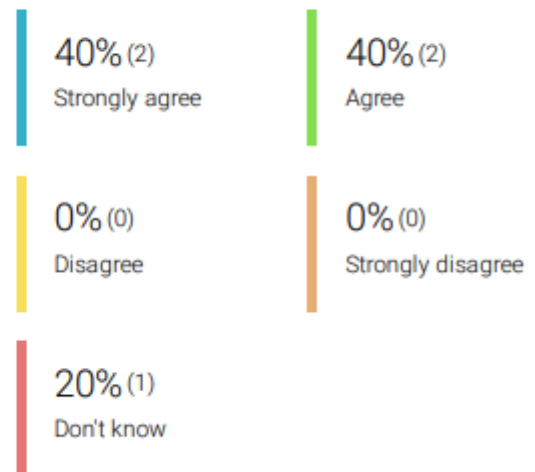
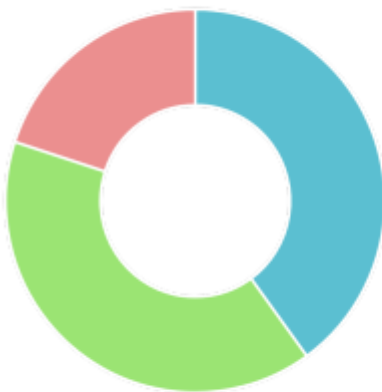
The results show that 21% have had no concerns they wished to raise. When concerns are raised, 71% of parents agree or strongly agree that they are dealt with properly. Two parents felt concerns had not been dealt with properly. If you feel a concern has not been dealt with properly then we would urge you to raise them with a senior member of staff so that we can resolve the situation promptly and to everyone’s satisfaction.

Does your child have special educational needs/or disabilities?



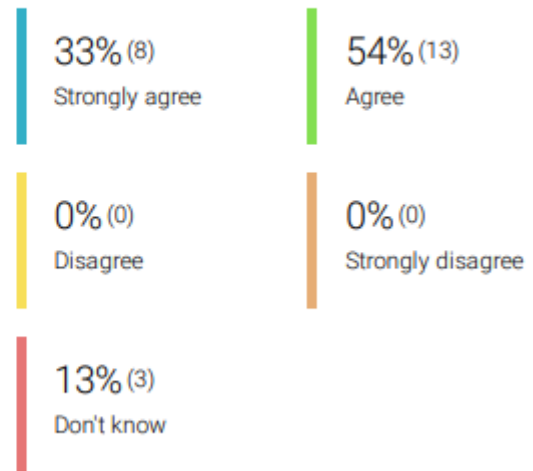
One respondent appears to have not answered this question.

If yes, how strongly do you agree with this statement: "My child has SEND and the school gives them the support they need to succeed."



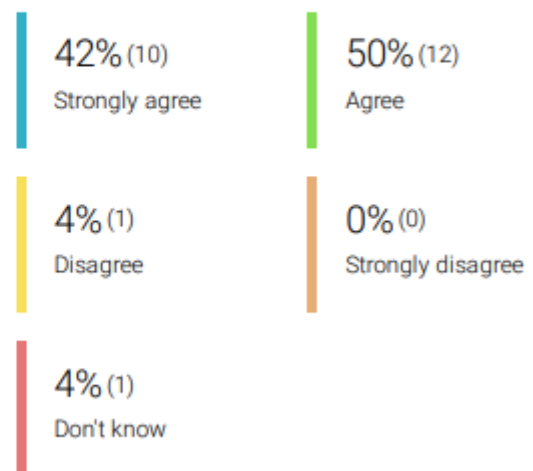
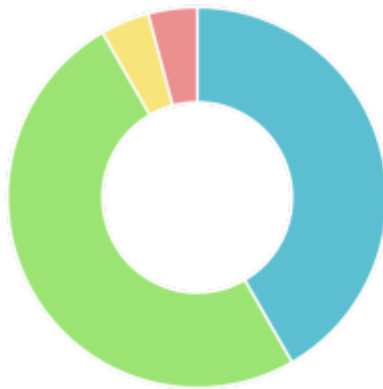
80% of parents are in agreement that school provides children with the SEND support they need. 20% did not know. All parents with children on our SEND list are invited to meet termly to review their individual progress and agree new targets. If you are unsure or have any questions then please speak to your child's teacher or our SENCO.

The school has high expectations for my child.



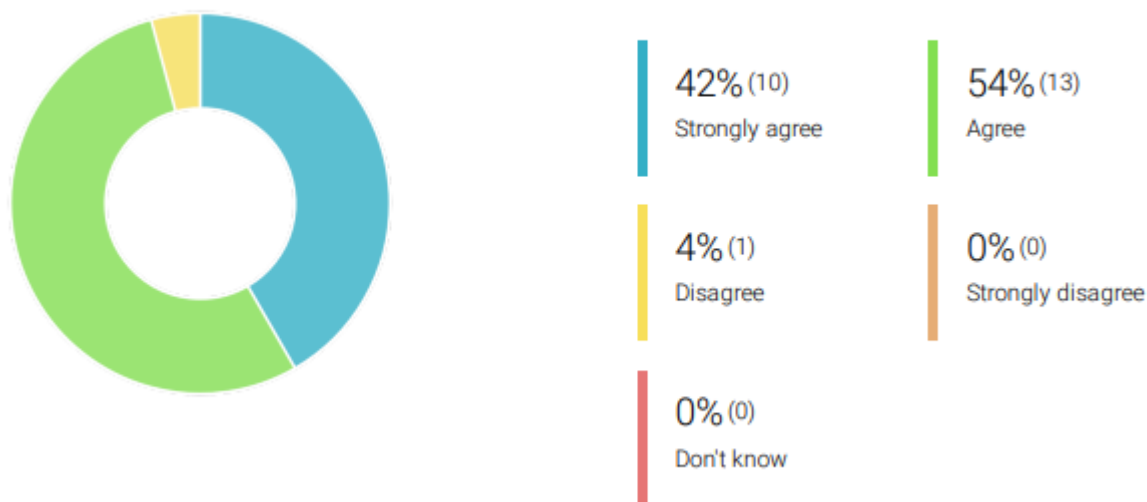
87% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed with this statement. 13% stated don't know. Our curriculum documents align with the aims and expectations of the National Curriculum and have been adapted to suit the needs of our school community. If you have any questions then please speak to your child's teacher in the first instance.

My child does well at this school.



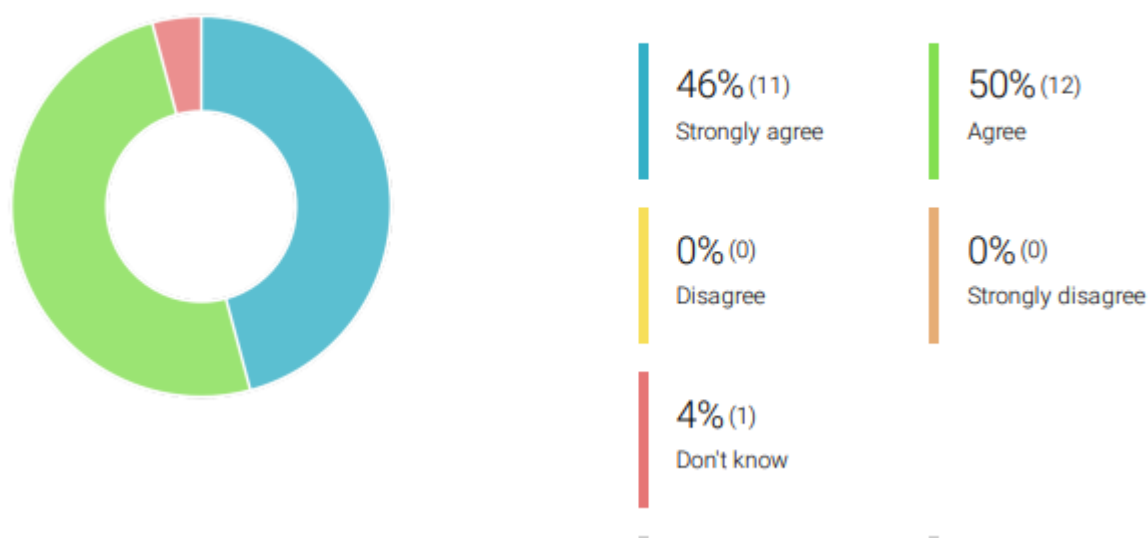
92% respondents agreed or strongly agreed with this statement. One respondent did not know and another disagreed. Parents have the opportunity to attend two parents' evening per year and receive an end of school report. We would urge any parents to contact the school if they have any questions about their child's education.

The school lets me know how my child is doing.



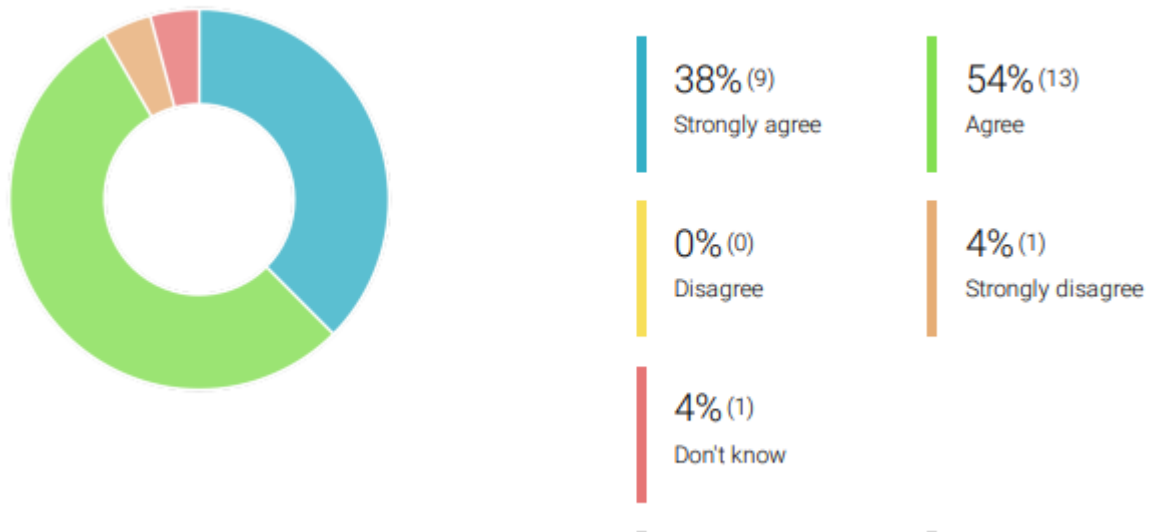
The vast majority of replies (96%) agreed or strongly agreed with this statement. One respondent disagreed. As mentioned in an earlier response, the school has a variety of ways to share learning with parents. It is acknowledged that Covid-19 has limited opportunities for parents to visit school for class assemblies and other performances although the school has ensured recorded versions have still been created and shared so that they had the opportunity to see them in the school setting during this time.

There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.



The school's curriculum ensures the full range of subjects from the National Curriculum are represented. Details of our curriculum are available on the school's webpage. We also send out weekly updates of the learning taking place in each class and Topic Fact Sheets at the start of each new topic.

My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school.



Covid-19 has severely impacted our ability to run clubs. However, a range of clubs have been made available since September 2022 including gymnastics, football, dodgeball, science amongst others. Letters are sent to parents in advance of clubs starting giving them the opportunity to sign up their children. We also hope to expand this provision as schools hopefully return to pre-covid status.
