Dahl (Class 2)

What a lovely start to Summer Term in Dahl Class! We started the week by beginning our Length and Height topic in Maths. We used cubes to measure objects in the classroom and throughout the week, we have learned how to use rulers and metre sticks to measure in centimetres and metres. In Geography, we learned about the equator and looked at weather forecasts to understand that the closer to the equator a country is, the hotter the climate. In PE, we have started Athletics in preparation for upcoming events this term. So far, we have focused on our sprinting technique – looking forwards, using our arms to help us and using the balls of our feet to help us to go faster.
